Bundaberg's Peter McClintock is an international athlete, father and now, Peer Mentor.

After sustaining paraplegia in a motorbike accident in January 1997 in Charters Towers, Peter was looking for a form of exercise that wasn't restricted by his spinal cord injury.

Introduced to wheelchair tennis, Peter had a talent for the sport and eventually played on the world circuit, spending four years living and competing for six months in Europe, and then returning to live in Australia with his family for six months.

Peter then enjoyed four years working for a recruitment company in the mining sector, before being lured back to sport – this time waterskiing. In 2007 he undertook the massive challenge of coordinating, and competing in, the Disabled Water Ski World Championships in Townsville. The event was a huge success and Peter was pleased to come fourth in the world.

In April 2009, Peter moved to Bundaberg with his three teenage sons Shaun, Gavin and Dylan. He plans to start training and get back into playing tennis once his youngest son has graduated from high school.
